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Terms & Conditions

- 1. Only residential home owners are eligible for the Cowichan 2024 FireSmart Rebate Program. Each applicant must meet the following criteria:
 - a. The applicant must be the home owner (as listed on land title or personal home insurance policy, proof may be requested);
 - b. The property must be the owner's primary residence, and/or occupied as a primary residence for all suites;
 - c. The home must be in CVRD electoral area A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, or I; and
 - d. The home must be within 200 metres of a high risk or extreme risk wildfire area.
- 2. Ineligibility: CVRD employees, either at their own homes or properties where they are listed on title, are not eligible to participate in the EMC FireSmart homeowner rebate program.
- 3. Limit one rebate per property. Landowners with more than one property may apply for a total of one rebate only.
- 4. Homeowners are eligible for a 50% reimbursement on mitigation work hours and expenses. To receive the maximum \$1,000 rebate, homeowners must complete \$2,000 worth of eligible work.
- 5. The minimum grant value is \$500. To receive the minimum \$500 rebate, homeowners must complete a minimum of \$1000 worth of eligible work. Work may include the homeowner's labour (valued at \$30/hr.), hired contractor invoices, purchased materials, or any combination of the above as per the recommendations on the FireSmart home assessment.
- 6. A FireSmart Home Assessment must be completed prior to starting work and a copy provided to EMC to confirm eligibility. The FireSmart have been done on or after January 1, 2021.
- 7. Only mitigation work recommended in the property's FireSmart Home Assessment Report will qualify for the rebate. Work not related to the recommendations of this report will not be eligible.
- 8. Mitigation work or expenses generated prior to the FireSmart Home Assessment are not eligible.
- 9. A limited number of rebates will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis at the sole discretion of EMC staff.
- 10. This Program may end without notice at the discretion of the Cowichan Valley Regional District, and/or Emergency Management Cowichan.
- 11. An inspection of mitigation work completed may be conducted by our FireSmart team or a Wildfire Mitigation Specialist to confirm your eligibility for the rebate. To complete this inspection, EMC staff may visit the property to confirm that eligible work was completed.
- 12. Proof of work completed is required. Final submissions will be required to include a completed a Program Work Hours Form, copies of invoices from contractors, and/or payment receipts for materials, whichever are applicable.
